When is the School of Nursing Convocation for our undergraduate students?

The School of Nursing's Undergraduate Convocation will start at 8:00 AM sharp on the Main Stage of the Staller Center on Friday, May 24th, 2013. Please begin arriving at 7:30 AM. Are tickets required for guests?

Tickets are required for every guest who will attend the School of Nursing's Undergraduate Convocation (8:00 AM, May 24th, Staller Center Main Stage). Each student will be given three tickets for their guests to attend this event. Graduates do not need tickets. Tickets must be presented by guests at the door for entry. You may pick up the Convocation tickets between May 8th through May 10th, 2013 between the hours of 9:00 AM and 7:00 PM in the School of Nursing from Jan Kavazanjian if you are a BBP/ABP student or Kathy Miller if you are an RNBP student. If available, an additional ticket (one per graduate) will be offered at a later date. If you do not have tickets for guests and family, they will not be able to attend either Commencement or Convocation. Student identification is required when picking up tickets.

Tickets are also required for every guest who will be attending the University Commencement Ceremony (11:00 AM, May 24th, Kenneth P. LaValle Stadium).

Are robes required?

All candidates planning to attend either Commencement or Convocation must be robed. Retainable RED caps, gowns and hoods can be purchased at the University Bookstores. For more information, visit:

What takes place at the School of Nursing Convocation?

Faculty, students and platform guests proceed into the Staller Center. The Dean provides a welcome, introduction of the platform participants, and introduces the Convocation Speaker. Following the Convocation address, students are announced individually to receive mock diplomas and walk across the stage. A Pinning Ceremony will be part of this Convocation.

What do I actually receive during Convocation?

You will be given a mock diploma as you walk across the stage. The actual diplomas will be mailed within eight to ten weeks after commencement.

When will I receive my diploma?

Your diploma, a symbol of academic excellence and perseverance, will arrive approximately eight to ten weeks after the ceremony. While this may seem like a long time, it is the time needed for our records office to verify the completion of your academic program. An additional few weeks are necessary for the printing, packaging and mailing of diplomas.

Can my family/guests take photos/videos?

Unfortunately, there is limited space at the staging area for outside photographers. Our ushers are instructed to keep non-participants away from the stage area so that the audience can view the ceremony. Your guests may take photos and/or videos from their seats. The cameras must contain their own battery packs since electrical outlets are not available. Please ask your guests to refrain from using bright lights with video cameras since these are often distracting to others.

How long does Convocation last?

The School of Nursing has maintained the tradition of announcing the names of all graduating students, the convocation should last approximately 2 hours. Students will remain in their seats until the recessional. At that point, all students proceed outside. Please make arrangements with family and guests to meet at a specific site outside the Staller Center after the ceremony.

Can I leave my coat and/or purses in the rooms in the Staller Center?

NO. The rooms in the Staller Center will NOT be locked or monitored during the ceremony. You will not be readmitted to the robing rooms after the processional starts, or after the ceremony. Please leave coats, purses and other personal items with your guests.
